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<p>from Guillaume (IRC): The IRC implemented the Community scorecard approach in 151 health facilities. We are working on a follow-up paper. What our data seems to suggest is that people rapidly hit a “collective action ceiling” whereby all problems which have their source at the local problems are resolved, yet problems which have their source outside of the local level are not resolved. In other words, it affects the local system, but does not translate in change at the “system” level. Does you data on the type of problems resolved/not resolved would point in a similar direction (i.e. local problems resolved, system problems not resolved)?</p>	Gill: 01:24:15
